These very big waves can be caused by underwater quakes, and can be dangerous.




Diseases

 I make buildings. I use lots of tools and can make homes and work buildings







NATURAL DISASTERS DOMINOES

- This is a whole class activity that can be done in groups or pairs.
- Students are given a board and the picture/description paper and have to match the description to the Natural Disasters and glue it to the board
- They go horizontal across the top and the bottom and vertically along the sides.
- When you (or the students) cut out the dominoes make sure there is a picture AND a description on the domino (dominoes have two sides)
- Make sure the students know how to glue them as sometimes they will stick them all at the top.
- Once they have finished, they can complete the centre part of the board and answer the two questions as well as list the disasters.
- I will add a started version at the bottom to show you how it works. (the board should be printed on A3 and the dominos on A4.)
